Whether it's your customers' contact information, donor giving records, a history of your important events/fundraisers, or the name of the print shop where you get your business cards — your important information needs to be stored in an organized, reliable, and accessible system.

Food banks need to track client visits, family information, bags/boxes of food taken, weight of food (and other items), and produce reports for cities, funders, staff, and boards.



501 Commons has helped develop a “Food Bank Services” system that incorporates a host of helpful features into Salesforce. We’ve extended work done by Evan Callahan of Salesforce.org to enable the types of features that food banks are accustomed to using, such as the ClientCard Access database built by Ken Craig.

It’s built on top of the Nonprofit Success Pack, enabling food banks to be able to harness the full power of Salesforce by using a product that’s customized for their unique needs. See below for a list of some of the top features we can incorporate into your database system.

1. Clean interface, available in any browser on tablets, Macs, and PCs
2. Intake check in/check out
3. Customizable commodities
4. Box size or points
5. Ability to build reports like visit history

9. Built on NPSP Contact Account model, with the full power of Salesforce being available
